Dear Students, Parents and Guardians:

The school year will soon draw to a close and, in looking ahead to next year, I would like to provide you with the following information on behalf of your School Board and Student Transportation Services (STSCO). Over the summer and throughout the school year, in order to increase student awareness of bus safety and to provide families with bus routing information, the following events and services will be offered:

Accessing Student Busing Information - STSCO will be using several means of providing you with busing information for the coming school year, including:

- 1) **Student Transportation Services Website (stsko.ca)** – As was the case last year, parents and families will be able to log in to STSCO's website, scroll down to the "Transportation Bus Lookup" item, click on it and check information for students. It will be necessary for you to have your child's OEN number (found on top right corner of student's June report card) and their birth date for security purposes. Once logged in, busing information will be displayed on the screen. In addition, please visit the website to learn more about bus safety, student transportation (including summer school routing) and STSCO in general.
- 2) **Interactive Voice Response System (IVR)** - This is a phone based system which you can access after August 15 by calling the local (Peterborough area) telephone number **748-9240** or the toll free, long distance number **1-866-433-4441**. Upon calling, you will need to provide a nine digit student number specific to each child (this is found on the top of the first page of their June Report Card directly to the right of their name and is normally identified as their "OEN" or "ID") and their birth date. Also, in the weeks prior to August 15, from 9 a.m.-9 p.m., the IVR system will be used to call-out to families and remind them that they can access a transportation information on STSCO's website.

First Rider Program sessions - These events will be held over the last few weeks of August and will involve a fun introduction to safety training and a first bus ride for young students. Dates for your area are posted on the STSCO website and will also be sent home by your school. Please note the dates on your home calendar and take part if your family includes young children.

Wrist Band Program - For Kindergarten and other young students, schools will be provided with wrist bands which will be offered to parents for use in recording the student's bus route, stop information and school. At the start of the school year, this will help the student, as well as school staff and bus drivers, to determine their proper bus. Families are encouraged to take part in the program.

"Buster the Bus" - Buster is a motorized, talking miniature school bus which, along with his friendly operators, will visit many elementary schools to provide a presentation on school bus safety.

Bus Safety and Emergency Evacuation Training - Periodically, during each school year, bus companies will visit schools to offer training sessions aimed at teaching students bus safety rules and what to do in case of an emergency. The program helps to keep safety in the forefront for students.

Families and students are encouraged to take advantage of the above offerings.
